All chapter sizes should have a director of scholarship. They report to the vice president: member education and serve on both the joint chapter management team (JCMT) and Nominating Committee. The director of scholarship implements the chapter scholarship program and helps the chapter achieve its academic goals. Depending on chapter size and structure, they oversee a scholarship committee.
