

# Five Star Programming Ideas

Alumnae groups should focus their programming on meeting their membership needs in the areas of sisterhood, membership, community, Foundation and networking. Remember that one event can fall into multiple areas of the Five Star Programming model.

Alumnae groups should also keep in mind the Fraternity Standards for Alumnae Groups Standard #11:

Fulfilling all required programming expectations in a thoughtful and intentional way.

- Groups that are alumnae chapters hold at least 6 events per year. Groups that are alumnae associations hold at least 3 events per year.
- Group officers plan a variety events that are inclusive of all generations utilizing the Five Star Programming Model with events focused in each of the programming areas: sisterhood, membership, community, Foundation, and networking.
- Group officers shall make every reasonable attempt to attend the events hosted by the alumnae group.
- Group officers actively seek feedback from members on programming satisfaction.
- Group officers have added all alumnae group events to their group's Anchorbase calendar.

We encourage you to use the below programming ideas to inspire events that you feel would benefit your membership.

- Offer gift wrapping (donation based, and money goes to a service for sight organization)
- Champagne & Chocolates Gala (silent auction, dinner, live auction with Guide Dogs and collegians as "Live Auction Models and Golden Ticket Girls")
- Tapas and Tiaras (snack on appetizers while shopping for jewelry)
- Little Black or Red Dress Party (cocktail party hosted at an alumna's home with silent auction with an entry fee and a guest speaker to talk about Foundation related topic)
- Rays of Light (a night of fun for sight impaired and their families)
- Pink Flamingo Flocking (members get orders from supporters to have someone "flamingoed". Suggested price for "flocking" \$10- \$30 and anti-flocking insurance \$10. Flamingos placed in yard at night and left with note left saying friends paid in support of fundraiser)
- Eye Love Art (sell Braille school artwork at auction)

- Swap till You Drop! (swap with sisters to have a DG networking event)
- LinkedIn Event (network with others who work at same organization. For example, send postcard to all DGs working at Disney giving them the names of others)
- New Member Happy Hour
- Welcome brunch post-graduation for seniors to welcome them to the alumnae group
- Board meetings on Zoom or free teleconferencing
- Girls Night Out/Doing Good Deeds
- Social media (Have a group on Facebook, use Twitter, etc.)
- Working DG lunch (hold a downtown professional development activity)
- Hold a weekly lunch meet up for sisters working in the city

- Send Upcoming Events postcard or magnet
- Include an option to pay dues
- Offer to pick up a sister and carpool

## Follow-Up:

- Send thank you email, handwritten note or call attendees
- Check in with sisters who have missed a few events and share info about an upcoming event
